June 8, 1938 - May 24, 2020

Barbara K. Campana, dedicated mother, grandmother, sister, aunt, friend, and teacher passed away on Sunday, May 24.

Barbara was born in Harrisonburg, Virginia on June 8, 1938. She was the eldest daughter of Lavelle L. and Virginia M. Koogler.

Barbara is survived by her daughters Lynne Rapier (Bob) and Julie Borghese (Steve); sisters Gayle (Jack) Parr and Sandra (John) English; grandchildren Justin, Corbin, Madison, Nathan, and Sophia; nephews Kevin and Greg and nieces Debbie and Ashton. She was preceded in death by her loving parents, Lavelle and Virginia Koogler, and adoring husband Herman J. Campana.

Barbara dedicated her entire life to teaching and education. She graduated from Bridgewater College in 1960 with a Bachelor of Arts and started her career in Elementary Education. She moved to Columbus, Ohio in 1971, and took a break from teaching to raise her young daughters. When they started school, Barbara resumed her career as a reading specialist for the Columbus Public Schools and later moved into her own classroom, teaching 4th grade until she retired in 1998. Barbara's passion for teaching continued even after retirement. Her grandchildren fondly remember grandma's days filled with love, fun, and education. As they grew older, grandma's days included tutoring, correcting research papers (with the dreaded red pen) and studying for the ACT. Barbara also spent many years teaching at the Delaware Area Career Center where she helped adult students prepare to take their GED. She attended each graduation ceremony and celebrated with her students, officially retiring when she was 80.

Barbara was a member of Liberty Presbyterian Church and loved taking part in worship services and Friday morning Bible Study. She deepened her Bible studies on a pilgrimage to Israel in 2009, when she visited the Sea of Galilee, rode a camel up Mount Sinai by moonlight, and left a prayer at the Wailing Wall in Jerusalem for each one of her family members and friends.

Barbara was our sunshine, our family's rock. She lit up a room, making everyone in it feel special. She touched so many lives with her kindness, generosity, and love. Her family was her top priority and she was there for each one of us, our biggest supporter. She loved getting together with family and friends, always insisting on doing something to help.

Her desire to make a difference in people's lives was evident in everything she did, but nothing stands out more than her love for her family and friends.

A private family graveside service will be held on Friday.
