



## Esther Maxine Bartelt (Snoufffer)

March 5, 1924 - October 8, 2021

She was the mother of Susan (Snoufffer) Kuhn Melvin of Worthington and Nancy (Snoufffer) Morris of Zionsville, Indiana, the grandmother of four (of the world's cutest) grandchildren (Stephanie Clemmons, Megan Covert, Robyn Griffey, and Christopher Kuhn), grandsons-in-law (Bill Clemmons, Chance Covert and Peter Griffey), granddaughter-in-law (Erica Kuhn), four great-grandchildren (Parker and Rayne Covert and Lauren and Rylie Kuhn), two sons-in-law (Guy Melvin and Arthur Morris), nieces, nephews, cousins and many, many friends. She was predeceased by husbands Fred Snoufffer and A. W. "Bart" Bartelt. But more than any of these mentioned souls, she loved the Lord with every fiber of her being.
