Sandy Brenner, 71, of Westerville/Galena, Ohio peacefully passed away November 28, 2020, in her home. She was born on November 15, 1949, to Robert and Betty Pratt, in Newark, Ohio. She married John on August 25, 1979, also in Newark. Sandy graduated from Newark High School in 1967. Sandy always wanted to be a nurse. That became a reality when she became a RN in 1984, and then earning her BSN degree from Ohio University in 1988. She served in many capacities, but loved being a hospice nurse. Over the years she was an active member of First United Methodist Church (Newark, Ohio), Memorial Presbyterian Church (Midland, Michigan), and Liberty Presbyterian Church (Delaware, Ohio). Whether that be her hospice patients, the residents at ORW, Syrian refugees, or the lonely person in the church pew. Sandy had the unique ability to touch everyone she met. She will be dearly missed. She is survived by her husband, John Brenner; son, Michael Brenner; daughter-in-law, Dr. Amy Brenner and grandson, Michael. She is preceded in death by her parents and sister, Elizabeth Ann Acord.
