Steve was choir director at Indian Run Methodist Church for 15 years. Was a board member of The Dublin Arts Council for 6 years, 2 of which he was president. For the last 10 years, Steve was an active golf member together with his wife at Scioto Reserve Country Club. One of Steve's proudest moments during his golf career was his Hole-in-One at St. John's Golf Club in St. Augustine, FL. on February 8, 2008.


