Agnes Whittington Poteet passed away on Tuesday, March 10, 2026. She was born on a farm outside Canal Winchester on January 19, 1936, during a blizzard, to Howard (“Whit”) and Georgia Whittington. Agnes earned both her bachelor’s and master’s degrees from The Ohio State University and spent many fulfilling years teaching math and social studies at Woodward Park Middle School. She married Bill Poteet on December 22, 1957, and they shared 67 years of marriage before he preceded her in death on January 24, 2025.

Family was the joy of Agnes’s life. She is survived by their three daughters, Leanne (Janice), Cherry (Nancie), and Tanya (Mark); their son, Scott (Pamula); and her grandchildren Graham (Becky), Julian, Chloe, Jessi (David), Jacob (Chelsea), Kayden (Selahja), Caroline, Taylor, Frederick, Franklin, and Marshall, and treasured great-grandchildren, Raeshawn and Piper.
