ALMA CATHERINE HUBER OLOFSON, age 89, of Friendship Village, Columbus, Ohio, passed away on April 16, 2009, at St. Ann's Hospital after a short illness. She was a member of Chi Omega sorority, Arts Societies and Garden Clubs in various cities, Geneva Fellowship, and the Worthington Presbyterian Church. She also enjoyed her women's book clubs.
