“ I met Amy during the summer of 1989, she was a beautiful and polished, 28 year old Personnel Director at the Radisson North in Columbus. I was teaching UPS’s Management School there with a different class each week. Amy and her staff worked with me throughout that summer, and we became very good friends. It was almost a year later that we ever went on a date, and then our friendship blossomed into a 30 year love affair. Our first date was hiking in the Hocking Hills with a stop at Rocky Boot Factory in Nelsonville where I bought Amy a new pair of hiking boots, which she immediately adorned with fluorescent green laces. Amy was that once in a lifetime person that you are lucky enough to meet, let alone fall head over heels in love with.
