Annabel M. Loren "Bunny" Young of Worthington and Friendship Village, died peacefully on Friday, February 8, 2008, in Kobacker House (Hospice), with her sister by her side. She had been fighting the effects of COPD for some years. Bunny was born June 18, 1924, and was preceded in death by her parents Grace M. and James M. Loren, Jr., and her only cousin Mary Jeffrey Shannon Strudwick of NY. She was the widow of Richard Edson Young, deceased 1983. She graduated from The Ohio State University in 1945 with a degree in journalism. She lived in Muncie, IN for 23 years, where Bunny and Dick raised their three children. She was a great mom, had a network of wonderful friends, and was a community volunteer for many years before returning to journalism to write for the Muncie Evening Press. She and Dick made their home in Wooster, OH, for several years before moving to Nagoya, Japan for Dick's job with Borg-Warner. Bunny and Dick retired to Worthington, OH, where she continued to write for the Chamber of Commerce, the Historical Society, and Delta Theta Phi national legal fraternity. She maintained a love of reading and writing her entire life. She enjoyed golf and ikebana as well as being a respectable bridge player. She was a member of Kappa Alpha Theta Alumnae, Mortar Board Alumnae, Worthington Historical Society, Worthington Women's Club, Questers, and was a founding member of the Alzheimer's Disease Association Board of Trustees.
