Brad Conrad, 66, died suddenly on the evening of June 28. As per his final instructions there will be no viewing, service or interment; his remains will be cremated.

He is survived by his wife of 45 years, his mother, three siblings, their descendants and relatives, and his many friends. Brad graduated from North Union High School in 1973 and continued some college classes at Ohio State and Ohio Northern University. He was retired from the construction industry and during the course of that career he lived in Worthington OH, Guthrie OK, Indianapolis IN and Powell OH. He moved to Delaware OH in December 2020.

In Indianapolis he acquired a love of auto racing and followed NASCAR closely; his favorite drivers were Jimmy Johnson and Jeff Gordon. He also loved to collect -- what didn't he collect? but he especially enjoyed Coke memorabilia, music and hand-made items including art, figurines, and construction artifacts. He would look at an old toolbox hand-made from scraps and see not a dirty, awkward piece of junk but a valuable tool that was helpful to a professional throughout his many years of work.

He had serious health issues in the past several months, but he seemed to be making progress. His friends and family should be comforted since he went quickly, as he wanted, and he did not appear to suffer, which is what we all want. God bless his soul and keep
