Charles Raymond DesJardins, 83, of Carson City, Nevada passed away on April 8, 2020 with his family in Dublin, Ohio. He was born on October 1, 1936, in Gilroy, California, the son of the late Raymond and Nina (Roberts) DesJardins. In addition to his parents, he is preceded in death by his beloved wife, Modesta Ronato DesJardins and his brother, Robert DesJardins. Charles was a lifelong sports enthusiast. In high school he lettered in a record four sports: football, baseball, basketball and track and field. He excelled as a

long distance runner and was a top-ranked senior marathon runner. He served as an executive member of the US Track and Field Association and traveled the world representing the US.
