Charles Thomas Mack, affectionately known as Tom or "Skeeter," passed in peace at home, surrounded by family on October 3rd, 2024 in Dublin, Ohio. Tom was born in Winchester, Indiana, on January 21, 1937. Tom lived a life filled with love, family, and passion for the things he held dear. In 1997, after 25 dedicated years, Tom celebrated his well-deserved retirement from Abbott Laboratories. His career began in Chicago as a Ross Laboratories sales representative, where he sold the iconic green can of Similac to doctors and hospitals. Later, he earned the affectionate title of the "Grandfather of Adult Nutritional" after playing a key role in introducing ENSURE to the marketplace.

Tom's enthusiasm for life extended well beyond his professional accomplishments. A passionate sports fan, he especially loved following Indiana University basketball and was a devoted fan of legendary coach Bobby Knight. He was also a proud member of IU's Phi Kappa Psi fraternity.

Tom had a zest for adventure and enjoyed spending time in nature. He loved hunting, fishing, and dancing; and for 20 years, he relished his time living the beach life on Edisto Island. To him, Edisto Island was not just a getaway, it was home. He was actively involved in the Edisto community as a member of St. Frederick and St. Stephen's Catholic Church, Lions Club, Botany Bay Natural Preserve, Edisto Island Museum, and Animal Lovers of Edisto. Tom

also served as a board member for The Hammocks Community, where he and his beloved wife, Joan, warmly welcomed family and friends into their home.

In 2020, Tom and Joan returned to Dublin, Ohio, where they continued to find community and support at St. Joan of Arc and St. Peter Roman Catholic Church.

Tom had many passions, including his love for farm gardening and canning the fresh vegetables he grew. He shared his love of Mexican food and took great pride in his kitchen skills, always cooking with joy. In his later years, painting rocks became a therapeutic hobby, offering him peace and creative expression.

Above all, Tom loved his family deeply. He is survived by his devoted wife, Joan; sons, Gregory (Angie) and Jeffrey (Dannielle); daughters, Jennifer Medici (Jean-Aimé) and Katie Sochor (Justin); grandsons, Tyler Mack, Travis Mack, Connor Mack, and Mason Sochor; granddaughter, Sydney Sochor; and the families of his sister, Joanna Owens (Chuck), and his brother, Phillip Mack (Nancy).

Tom always found joy in the little things, and one of his greatest pleasures was the song Joy to the World by Three Dog Night. The line 'Jeremiah was a bullfrog' never failed to bring a smile to his face, and it became a tradition for everyone around him to sing along. This song was more than just a melody to him—it reflected the spirit of Jeremiah from the Bible, who, even with a broken heart, stood firm in the truth, no matter the cost. Like Jeremiah, Tom knew that this world was not his final home, and he lived his life with the hope and faith of an eternal home beyond. His life was a testament to his faith, and he will be remembered for his unwavering dedication to the Lord.

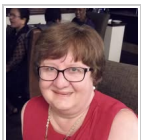
