would also see Kathy Blevins. She and her daughter, Nicole shared the “care giving” duties, but were more like family to Connie in these last 4 years. Connie could be found on Tuesdays and Thursdays with the “Iaconna Gang.” This special group of friends met weekly and enjoyed food, fellowship and on occasion, a bit of travel.
