He graduated from Marion Harding High School in 1935, Harvard University in 1939 and The Ohio State University Medical School in March, 1943. Damon was a medical doctor, specializing in Allergy and Chest

Disorders for 50 years. He was so very passionate about medicine, his wonderful staff and beloved patients. Dr. Wetterauer was a leader in Tuberculosis care for 20 years, starting in the 1940s. In addition to running his own practice, Damon was a highly valued staff member of the London Prison Farm, Mt. Logan Sanitorium in Chillicothe, Rambo Chest Clinic of Zanesville, and the O.S.U. Allergy Clinic. He was also on staff at Grant, Riverside and The Ohio State University hospitals, a member of The American Medical Association and Alpha Kappa Kappa medical fraternity. Damon was a devoted member of his faith community. He was an usher and served on many committees at Worthington United Methodist Church. In his free time, Damon enjoyed playing golf, tennis, horseshoes, croquet, bike riding, jogging and all other outdoor activities he could involve his family and friends in. Being a private pilot was another passion of Damon's. He was a member of The Flying Physicians Association, Aircraft Owners and Pilots Association and The American Bonanza Society. He flew all over the nation in his Bonanza airplane, landing frequently at his favorite vacation spot, North Myrtle Beach, SC. There he loved taking long walks on the beach and admiring the magnificent view from his favorite spot on the balcony. Damon was a Buckeye fan through and through, rooting his team to many victories and belting out the fight song along the way. Of all Damon's passions and accomplishments, his family was his heart and soul. We could not ask for a better man to be our patriarch, husband, father, brother, uncle, grandfather, great grandfather, mentor and friend. We will miss him dearly and will always hold our memories close to our hearts.
