Danny E. Justice, age 60, passed away Friday February 12, 2016. Survived by his wife Melissa, son Jacob (Carla) Justice, daughter Brittney (Kenny) Tarrence, step-son Ryan Middleton, sister Brenda (Bill/Tub) Davis, brother Dave (Pam) Justice and favorite Aunt & Uncle/Brother, Ron and Nancy Shortridge. He was preceded in death by his parents Sammy and Nell Justice and son Lawrence Jennings Justice.

Danny graduated in 1973 from Northland High School, then studying at Lincoln Tech before going to work for General Motors. He retired after 30 years in 2006, returning home to Ohio to enjoy his retirement. As the Lawn Ranger he fulfilled his dream to “mow the lawn” for barely enough to cover the expenses – until the equipment broke! He enjoyed working in his own yard, at times cutting the neighbors’ grass so all the yards looked good. The Ohio State Buckeyes were dear to him, shouting Hot Damn every time they scored. Saturday mornings were spent watching Gun Smoke and Rawhide. Sundays in the fall he cheered for the Cleveland Browns with hope they might win a game. Danny loved hunting, a quick vacation to the Keys or Colorado Rocky Mountains. One of his last pleasures was his golf cart, decked out with Ohio State stickers, a stereo and lights. He was a wealth of information with an answer for every question. One summer he read the Bible from cover to cover, signing his name and the date he finished – then proudly telling anyone his favorite parts that they should read.

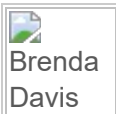

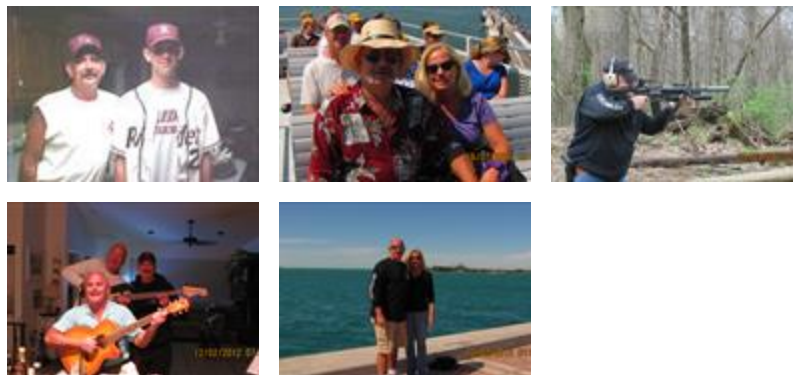
