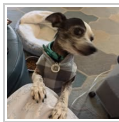

To the family of David Dayton - My wife and I were shocked and saddened to hear of Mr. Dayton's passing. He was a memorable and highly respected teacher and police officer.

I was a student in his history class at Worthington High School (WHS class of '68). My wife Judy (Carlisle) was also a member of his history class (WHS class of '69). We also knew him as he served in the Worthington Police Dept. We both have great memories of him.

My wife remembers one day when he brought his arsenal of police weaponry to the history class and carefully demonstrated all of the equipment to the students!

I was not only in his history class, but he was also one of my football coaches during my sophomore year. I also occasionally encountered him as a police officer on weekends during some of my youthful indiscretions as a young stupid teenager getting into trouble. He always gave me good advice about life situations, although I shrugged it off as a know-it-all youth. Some years later, though, his words echoed in my head when I found myself as a soldier during the Vietnam war.

Mr. Dayton was a permanent influence on my life and one of my favorite teachers at Worthington. I knew I deserved it when Officer Dayton was writing me that speeding ticket or lecturing me about squealing the tires on my '55 Ford! I always respected him and considered him a friend. I will always remember him fondly.
