David James Hess Jr, age 92, of Lewis Center, OH passed away March 9, 2025, with family by his side. He was born on September 25, 1932, to David J and Irene Hess in Columbus, OH. Attended Bexley HS where he met his wife Phyllis and graduated in 1952. He was drafted into the Army during the Korean War and served from 1952 to 1954. He married Phyllis Ream in 1958 in Columbus, OH. He was a home builder most of his life working for Homer Schaffner then Rankin and Thoman Builders. He received an award from the Builders Exchange in Columbus for a curved stairway he fabricated which was the first time the award was given to a non-union carpenter and a home builder. He also built the family home on Powell Rd in 1965. Later in life, he worked as the Head of Maintenance at St. Charles Preparatory School in Bexley. Dave has a lover of all sports. He was a football and baseball athlete during high school and college. He even played football on the Fort Riley Kansas Army team during the war. He was the manager of a softball team for many years then continued playing softball in an "old timers" league until 79 years of ages. He was a member of the Central Ohio Grasshoppers, a golf group for 25 years. He volunteered at various sport functions for Olentangy Schools as an assistant coach, clock keeper for football and basketball games and managed the side yard markers during football games when needed. I have many fond memories of my dad and mom, but one of my favorites about Dad was when he served in the Army. He was attached to the 101st Airborne division in the US Army. During training one day, they learned how to fire a grenade off their M1 rifle. The instructors said it was impossible to fire the grenade from the shoulder, as the recoil would break the bones. Instead, they were instructed to plant the rifle stock into the ground before firing. Well, Dad just had to test this theory. He successfully fired from his shoulder, but nearly broke it and suffered a huge, bruised area, remaining sore for weeks. He was tough as nails in sports and manned a 50-caliber machine gun during his time in Korea. However, after returning, he never wanted to own or fire a gun for the rest of his life. He was honorably discharged from Fort Riley in Kansas and wanted to come home so badly that he rode his motorcycle back to Columbus through a snowstorm, nearly freezing to death since he had no civilian winter coat or gloves. Looking back, he was tough and a little stubborn at times, but also a kind and giving man.

He instilled a sense of education and service in all three of his children, who voluntarily joined the US Army and Ohio National Guard. We each completed six years of service, obtained honorable discharges, and qualified for the Ohio tuition assistance program. We proudly followed in his footsteps through service in the US Army and completed our college education, which he was not able to do since he was drafted into the war. All seven of Dave's grandchildren have attended or completed their college education. Military service was also passed down through one of his grandsons, who served in the United States Marine Corps as a canine handler and instructor. Another grandson completed four years in the US Navy and currently serves in the US Army as a Special Forces Green Beret. I am confident Dad is proud of the legacy he and Mom have instilled in the family as they look down today from Heaven.
