David L. Fulton passed away peacefully at home surrounded by his family in Powell, Ohio, on May 9, 2025 at the age of 86. A proud veteran, devoted family man, and dedicated professional, he leaves a remarkable legacy of service, hard work, kindness, and unwavering love for his family. He will be deeply missed by all who had the privilege of knowing him.

David is survived by his loving wife of 59 years, Jane; daughters Sarah (John) Bann of Austin, TX, and Laura (Warren) Yamarick of Powell, OH; and grandchildren Ashleigh, Zach, Cole, and Katherine. He was preceded in death by his parents, Richard and Virginia Fulton, and siblings Sally Burch and Richard Fulton. His passing leaves a hole in the hearts of all who loved him.

Born in Athens, OH, on March 15, 1939, David graduated from Athens High School in 1957. After high school, David earned a track scholarship to Ohio University, where he began his undergraduate studies. He later transferred to the University of Akron and earned degrees in industrial communication. After serving in the Army and the Army National Guard, David began a distinguished career at the Goodyear Tire and Rubber Company in 1963. He retired after 32 years, having made a lasting impact in public relations and the racing division. He later founded his own company, Fulton Enterprises, Inc., where he continued his work with NASCAR and Indy Car racing. His career with Goodyear spanned 45 years.

David was a deeply caring and compassionate man, involved in his community through the Masonic organization, his church, the YMCA, and United Way. He will be remembered for his gentle nature, hard work, warm smile, and kind heart. A private funeral will be held at Greenlawn Cemetery in Akron, Ohio.
