Dorothy Eleen Scott, age 90, passed away Tuesday, October 4, 2011 at the Laurels of Worthington. Dorothy was born October 28, 1920 in Cardington, Ohio to the late Al V and Ione (Benson) Scott. In addition to her parents, her sister, Martha Windbigler, also preceded her in death. Her survivors include her nephew, Aaron (Susan) Windbigler of Mt. Gilead; niece, Jeannine Windbigler (Scott Ault) of Columbus; and treasured cousins and friends. Dorothy was a 1937 graduate of Johnsonville High School, and a graduate of the University of Rio Grande. She retired in 1987 after 45 years as an elementary teacher of the Vinton County Local School District. Dorothy was a member of the McArthur Methodist Church, McArthur Business and Professional Women; Alpha Omicron Chapter of Delta Kappa Gamma Sorority; the Senior Progress Club, Captain William Hendricks Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution; Ohio Education Association, National Education Association; the Vinton and Morrow County Retired Teachers' Association; Ohio Genealogical Society; the Society of Civil War Families of Ohio, and First Families of Ohio. Dorothy enjoyed traveling, having visited all 50 states, many countries, and many Elderhostel's. She also enjoyed genealogy, crewel and counted cross-stitch work. One of her prized possessions is a Ten-volume photo book of the pictures of the 970 students she was privileged to teach, and she treasured the time spent with her family, friends and former students.
