Evan C. Mercer, Sr., age 70, of Powell, OH and formerly a long-time resident of Mansfield, OH before moving to Powell, met his Lord and Savior at home on Tuesday, September 22, 2015. They were married in 1965 and celebrated 50 years together. Evan was the president of Mercer Impressions, Inc. He and Karen moved to Powell in 2004. Karen passed this summer on August 19, 2015.
