



## Frances Laura Bossert Gilbert

June 14, 1921 - December 1, 2015

Frances Laura Bossert Gilbert, 94, died peacefully Tuesday, Dec 1, 2015 at home in Delaware, Ohio. Born June 14, 1921 in Brookville, Indiana to the late Michael Bossert, Superintendent of Schools, Franklin County Indiana and Laura (Wolber) Bossert, schoolteacher. Frances enjoyed growing up in southern Indiana on the family farm with her brother, Robert Bossert and sister, Ruth Uebel who also preceded her in death as did their spouses Lucille Bossert and Martin Uebel. Frances graduated Capital University in Biology and taught in Coshocton, Ohio before raising her family in Worthington, Rocky River, Kenton and Delaware, Ohio. She served her communities in many capacities including PTA, Stephens Ministry and as Senior Warden at St John's Episcopal Church. Her annual Lenten practice was wearing a cross every day. Later in life, she worked for Richardson-Smith, now Fitch, and shared her home with interns and new associates at the firm who needed a place to live. She loved making friends young and old, literature, games including bridge, art, nature and most of all family. She is survived by her children Anne Gilbert (Peter Lefcourt), John Gilbert (Nancy Bergquist Gilbert), Jane Gilbert Sindel (Douglas) and Adam Gilbert (Camille Smith Gilbert); grandchildren, Molly, Natalie, Nathan, Eleanor and Mark; nephews, David (Judy) Uebel and Mark (Dawn) Uebel as well as great nieces and nephews and many dear friends. “ I learned today that Fran passed away. Many loving vibes to all her family, and much gratitude for how she lived her life! She was a dear friend and will be missed. I'm feeling the fullness and length of her life, my heart swells with the fullness of memories of her, and my time living in her homey farm house in Worthington, Ohio, in 1990. It was during my very first college design internship, at Fitch Richardson/Smith. She took in interns for a low cost, providing them with a nearby accommodation, blessed with her support, and she clearly savored their company too, staying in touch with many after they moved on. She was very spirited, with a wicked sense of humor, and young at heart in many ways. My memories of those times are charmed. We would often play crossword puzzles together after dinner. She had a great passion for it, and inspired the same interest in me. She was far sharper at it than me, and could nail a NYT puzzle. We would watch movies together too upstairs on her old skool floor model tv. / As an old design colleague said best "she showed so many of us how to live." She was a tough cookie at times, providing a disciplining nature at times, which I still needed when it came to sharing the load of house chores, combined with a strong nurturance. She made THE BEST bread pudding, and would often make it for me. I believe it was the birth of my love for it, and I still note it as my favorite dessert. / I have vivid memories of getting dozens of classic music LPs from the local library and listening to them in the midst of a big Ohio snow storm. Her old farm house had so much charm, and many beautiful vantage points out of the windows to the billowing white stuff outside. She had a heating blanket in my room as well, so once Mozart's "Coronation Mass" was playing, and the blanket was on, I was set (all basic needs met, and then some)! We would sometimes sit in her living room, and one of us would tinker on the old piano, which resonated nicely throughout the house. / I'm sad we never had a goodbye, or closure together, but am grateful for all the spirited and intimate Christmas and other letters we shared annually, and will always cherish them as scrapbook essentials. / I'll never forget the photo she had hanging in her kitchen of her doing a skinny dipping dive in a watering hole, perhaps in her '50s.
