July 29, 1922 - December 30, 2019

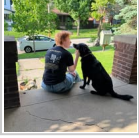
Francis J. Batchelder, age 97, passed away peacefully at Wesley Glen Retirement Community. He was born in Orange, NJ and lived most of his adult life in Pearl River, NY. Francis served in the US Navy Seabees during WW II. He graduated from University of Michigan. He also attended Columbia University, College of the City of New York, Fairleigh-Dickinson University and Columbus State Community College.
