



Fred "Fritz" Furbee

Fred "Fritz" S. Furbee, of Grandview Heights formerly of Upper Arlington, died peacefully in his sleep at his home on February 2, 2012. He was born July 15, 1924 to Fred and Mary Furbee in Marietta, Ohio. Fritz attended Notre Dame University prior to enlisting in the Army Air Corp. He had a distinguished career as a pilot flying C-47's in the Central Burma India-Burma China offensive, "The Hump". As a Captain he received The Distinguished Flying Cross for rescuing 22 nuns from behind enemy lines and flying them to safety. Fritz was also proud of his Chinese wings he received as a tribute from the Flying Tigers. He returned home after the war to Marietta and married his WWII sweetheart Charlotte Nelson, and then completed his college education graduating from Ohio University. Fritz and Charlotte moved to Upper Arlington in 1956 and he founded his business, Furbee-Hall Architectural Sales in 1962 which he ran for 35 years. He enjoyed sailing a Thistle with his family on Sunday afternoon races at Leatherlips Yacht Club, watercolor painting, making mustard, visiting with friends over a cold beer at Johnnies and he had a passion for vintage aircraft. He is preceded in death by his parents and his brother Dick W. Furbee of Naples, Florida. He is survived by his daughters Mary Ann (Don) of Upper Arlington and Rebecca Ann; his former wife Charlotte N. Furbee of Marietta, his sister-in-law Sue Furbee of Naples, Florida and many nieces and nephews. Fritz was a staunch conservative, and a believer in free enterprise, the entrepreneurial spirit and the value of a great sense of humor. He was a good man who lived life very much on his own

terms. Fritz will be laid to rest later this week at Mound Cemetery in Marietta, Ohio at a private service.
