Frederick L. Shaner, born November 28, 1925, passed away at his home in Tennessee on March 5th, 2014. Fred was preceded in death by his devoted wife of 64 years, Evelyn (Kibler) Shaner, sisters Margaret Beran and Orlena Stoltz, brother John Shaner, their parents Fred and Mary and granddaughter Elizabeth Finn. An alumni of Bucyrus High School, Fred served his country in the United States Air Force from 1944 to 1946. Following his military career, Fred graduated from the Ohio State University with a degree in Pharmacology. Fred was a lifetime member of the State of Ohio Pharmacy Association, and was installed as the 77th President of Toledo Academy of Pharmacy in 1970. An avid golfer and skilled craftsman, Fred was an active contributor to the Golden Hobby Shop, a non-profit consignment shop for Ohio senior citizens' handcrafted items.
