WILSON George Henry Wilson Jr., 92, died at his Columbus home April 15, 2010. He was a WWII Army veteran. George retired from WTOV in Steubenville, where he held a variety of on-air and behind-the-scenes positions. He is survived by his wife of 68 years, Marjorie (Porter) Wilson; his children, Melissa Hennessy (Mark), George H. "Chip" Wilson III (Jeanne), and C. Mark Wilson; grandchildren, Bryan King (Stacia), Kimberly King, Charles Wilson (Amanda), and Christopher Wilson (Sara); great-grandchildren, Samantha, Emily, and James; cousins, John and Joe Keeseey and Pam Ross. A 1935 graduate of Steubenville High School, George attended Wittenberg University on a Prince of Peace scholarship and was a proud member of Phi Gamma Delta fraternity. He was a member of Worthington Presbyterian Church and a former member of First Westminster Presbyterian Church. George served as President of both the Steubenville Rotary club and the Jefferson County Historical Society; and was active in the Ohio American Cancer Society . Known for his love of hats, sunflowers, Sanibel Island, and Spain, he is also remembered for his sense of humor and for his heartfelt portrayal of Santa in person, on the radio, and on TV.
