When Gordon and Tess decided to get married in the Philippines, little did he know that he was going for the trip of a lifetime. It must have been a huge culture shock to Gordon, but he very quickly learned and adapted to the closely-knit, matriarchal society in the Philippines.

A few years later, after settling into a quiet, married life, Gordon and Tess were jolted with the news that they were expecting triplets. On a visit to New York City when Tess was heavy with the triplets, they were on an escalator in a department store. Tess turn to Gordon and announced loudly to him, "Don't you think it's about time you married me?" Terribly embarrassed, Gordon could only react with his singular laughter. Life with triplets must have been a whirlwind that only a strong, quiet person like Gordon could handle.

Many years later, when my mother, Puring, was faced with living alone in the Philippines, Gordon very generously offered to take my mother into their home. He knew what he was in for, but his love for Tess and his generous spirit overcame any trepidations he may have had. For many years, he was a major caregiver of my mother. He would take her to her medical appointments, put up with her moods, made her laugh, and rescued her from dangerous situations. He took care of her like his own mother.

That was Gordon and much more. Gordon was a kind, warm and self-effacing person who had a ready smile and chuckle. As an artist he was always busy doing creative work. He was a perfectionist with his art and was satisfied only when he did his best.

I will miss my brother-in-law, his steady presence and his good-natured ways.
