Gwendolyn M. Cloud (nee Vannett), age 85, of Powell, died on Wednesday, November 25, 2020, at Willow Brook Christian Home in Columbus, with her family by her side. Born in Columbus, Gwen was the daughter of the late Glenn E. Vannett and Cleo Brentlinger Vannett. She was a graduate of Linden-McKinley High School. Gwen was preceded in death by her husband of 58 years, Jim Cloud, who died in 2014. Her brothers, Doyle and Robert, also preceded her in death.
