Harriet (Harri) Amurgis, 61, beloved daughter, sister, aunt, friend, and colleague, passed away suddenly while working at Riverside Methodist Hospital — where she selflessly brought comfort and love to countless patients, their family members, and her own co-workers — on June 18, 2015.
