Harriet Jane (Woodbury) Hodge, 92, died on March 25, 2009 at Sunrise Place, Worthington, OH after a long battle with Alzheimer's disease. She was born April 16, 1916 in Kansas City, MO. She was preceded in death by her parents, Frank H. and Sibyl Sweet Woodbury; her husband of 35 years, Campbell Hodge; sons Campbell Hodge, Jr. (Sandy) and Brian W. Hodge; a sister, Athelia Ann Stauffer and a brother, Frank H. Woodbury III. She is survived by a daughter, Martha Hodge Noreault of Powell, OH, 6 grandchildren, and 14 great-grandchildren. A brother, Robert L. Woodbury of Prairie Village, KS, daughters-in-law Andrea Slotmaker Carman of Montgomery, AL, and Sally Saville Hodge of Chicago, and son-in-law, Gary L. Fivecoat of Delaware, OH also survive her. Harriet graduated from Southwest High School, Kansas City, in 1933 and received a B.A. degree from Wellesley College in 1937. She was married to Campbell Hodge on July 20, 1940 in Kansas City. She resided in Chicago area suburbs from 1952 to 1997 where she was active in many organizations including The League of Women Voters of Winnetka, the North Shore Harmonizers (Barbershop Chorus), the Women's Society of the Winnetka Congregational Church, Friends of Senior Center and the Society of Descendants of the Mayflower of Illinois. Harriet was a Certified Genealogist and served as a volunteer in the genealogy area of the Winnetka Public Library for many years. She published eight books of family genealogy.
