Bunaken Marine Park is the most pristine waters I have dove in with, in most cases, a gentle current with a few big things mixed in with billions of little fish, numerous nudibranchs, and colorful coral make it very sweet eye candy. The trip to the sites are from 10 minutes to 1 hour in good seas. A big lunch is served on the return from Bunaken. I will return for sure.*
