Helen Lucinda (Cinda) Armstrong Barton, 81, of Grove City, Ohio passed away on April 23, 2025 after a brief illness. She was born on February 21, 1944 to the late Harold (Buck) and Ruth (Rochester) Armstrong in Portsmouth, Ohio. She was a lifelong educator, serving in the Columbus Public Schools for more than 30 years. Cinda earned an Associate Degree from Virginia Intermont College, a Bachelor's of Elementary Education from Rio Grande College, and a Master's of Education from Ashland University. She was a 1962 graduate of Portsmouth High School. Cinda was a Founding Member of Alpha Mu Beta at Rio Grande College and a long-standing member of Alpha Delta Kappa, Clintonville Woman's Club, Daughters of the American Revolution, Ohio Mayflower Society, and Columbus-Grove City B.P.O. Elks Lodge #37. She was a lifelong adventurer who traveled extensively, befriended everyone she met and lived her life to the fullest every step of the way.
