Helen M. L. McGuinness, 97, of Columbus, Ohio, formerly of Coshocton, passed over on April 7, 2014. She was the loving wife for 43 years of the late James L. McGuinness. Helen was born in Belleville, NJ in 1916, the daughter of Andrew and Hilda Hautala and raised in Spencer, NY. She is a graduate of Spencer High School, Class of 1934, and Central City Business Institute, Syracuse. She worked as secretary to the Medical Director of the Women's Medical Clinic at Cornell University and at Penn Mutual Insurance Company in Philadelphia during WWII. She lived in the Ithaca, NY area until moving to Coshocton, OH in 1955 where she was a communicant of Sacred Heart Church and member of the Coshocton Art Guild.
