



Herbert Wood Ockerman

January 16, 1932 - January 11, 2024

Herbert Wood Ockerman (91) passed away peacefully at home in Columbus, Ohio on Jan 11, 2024. Herb was born on Jan 16, 1932, in Chaplin, Kentucky. He was the son of Herbert and Addie Mae Ockerman. He graduated from Burlington High School in 1950, and from the University of Kentucky in 1954, where he met his wife, Frances. He then served in the United States Air Force. Following his service in USAF, he received a PhD from North Carolina State University. In 1961, he joined The Ohio State University as an Assistant Professor in the College of Food Agriculture and Environmental Science teaching biochemistry, microbiology, statistics and international studies. He retired as Professor in 2017, after serving for 56 years. He was preceded in death by his parents, Herbert and Addie Mae Ockerman and his wife, Frances Ockerman. Herb lived by his motto 'The World is your Classroom' and enjoyed travelling the world, visiting more than 50 countries. The awards and accolades he received from dozens of international universities and the lifelong friendships he made with his worldwide network of former students are a testament to his legacy and impact. For his many academic contributions Herb was awarded with honorary PhDs from Poland, Philippines and University of Kentucky. He established an endowment in his wife's name in 1988 to provide scholarships for graduate and undergraduate students in the College of Agriculture, Food and Environment at University of Kentucky. As part of his philanthropic initiative, Herb collected used textbooks from university libraries and local bookstores and donated them to schools and

colleges all over the world. For more than 20 years, he shipped forty thousand books annually to dozens of schools and colleges helping educate a whole generation of students who otherwise wouldn't have access to these books. He was a volunteer with the Honor Flight Columbus and was passionate about veteran causes, having served in the USAF himself. Herb is survived by his brothers, Don & Gwinn Ockerman, nieces and nephews, grandnieces and grandnephews and a worldwide fraternity of friends and students, the 'Ockerman Family'. Service will be held at 2 PM, Jan 19, 2024, at the Lexington Cemetery in Lexington, Kentucky. “ Dear family members of Dr. Herber Ockerman,

I have been attending ICoMST meetings since 1972, and Dr. Ockerman had started before me. He attended his last, 50th meeting in 2016 in Bangkok, Thailand, I attended my 50th meeting in 2021.

When I first met Dr. Ockerman, I immediately got the feeling that he was special, radiating great charisma and kindness. Now that I have known him for decades, this feeling is much stronger: now I know his career and especially his excellent contribution to foreign students from abroad, especially from developing countries. His influence in this field is significant and has left an impact that will influence a new generation in the countries that have been involved. The delivery of teaching materials to developing countries has also been very impressive and useful.

At ICoMST 2015 in Clermont Ferrand, we visited the art gallery. I entered a room there and had a stunning moment. There was a large group of young researchers sitting on the floor or on chairs, and Dr Ockerman. I realised that these young scientists were his former students. I saw the great respect and love on their faces, and I saw how much they appreciated the supervision, guidance and friendship they had experienced in his group. The feeling was so genuine and strong, and you can see it in the attached pictures.

The fourth picture is him and me. I have tried to follow his example in guiding foreign students, but my efforts have been a pale imitation of his great international collaboration. He was one of the great personalities who have contributed to a better world for all.

My sincere condolences to you on your great loss, but perhaps we should also be proud and happy that we were able to live with him and learn what it is to experience true humanity and warm friendship!

“ *My Homage to Prof. Ockerman*

Last night, when I heard the peaceful passing away of Prof. Ockerman in the arms of Amit and Lopa, I knew that it was his silent blessing to them for their care, love and affection.

My thoughts went back to that night in Shimla, when Professor and I sat in the open under a starry sky, chilled to the bones. Facing us were Amit and Lopa, the newly marrieds, in front of the Yagna fire, covered in a rug. The priest chanted hymns and I translated that they are now Shiva-Shakti, Consciousness and Power of Energy, praying for the welfare of everything that is created.

Professor was deeply moved, sat like a Buddha, eyes looking at the distant dark hills. I felt that he was thinking of the many thousands all over the globe for whom he had dedicated himself.
