Co., manufacturer of the first plastic straws. He had also founded the Mer Machine and Tool Co. Veteran of the US Navy, WWII. Member of Dublin Community Church, New England Lodge #4 F&AM, VFW Post 10691 Dublin and longtime member of Dublin Kiwanis.
