Inese Alese Neiders, Ph.D., JD – of Columbus, OH passed June 12, 2023 at the age of 76. She was predeceased by her parents Dr. Karlis Neiders and Erika (nee Valbergs) Neiders, DDS, as well as sister Velta Neiders.

Born in Darmstadt, Germany on January 14, 1947, Inese came to the United States with her family at a young age. An advocate of education, Inese first received her Bachelor's Degree in Psychology (Cum Laude) later receiving her Ph.D. in Sociology, and then again returning to graduate with a Doctorate of Law. Even recently, Inese would take online classes whenever she could to keep herself up to date on topics she found of interest. She was self-employed as a Jury Consultant for many years, and was still traveling for work and giving seminars up until her illness in June, 2023.

Besides her impressive career, she was perhaps best known as being an excellent and talented gardener. From vegetables to flowers, there was hardly anything she couldn't get to grow and flourish. She loved sharing her love and knowledge of gardening with her family and friends, and was always happy to share her plants and give advice if you were looking to expand your own garden. She was proud that her yard was once in the Clintonville Garden Tour. In her spare time from working and tending to her garden, Inese loved art. She could find the beauty in almost anything she saw, and loved to try her hand with many different mediums. Painting, stitching, pottery, metal work (all done in her basement) you name it – she did it, and often encouraged her grandchildren to do the same.

Inese leaves behind her cherished son, Erik (Lynn) Kreinbring and loving grandsons Zach Kreinbring, Nick Kreinbring, Joe Gatian all of Cincinnati, and Josh Gatian (Morgan Cundiff) of Bowling Green, OH – who will all miss her love, special phone calls full of stories, advice, jokes, and laughter. She also leaves behind her sister, Mirdza Neiders, DDS, MS of Buffalo, NY and brother Gunars (Regine) Neiders, Ph.D. of Renton, WA – as well as several cherished nieces, nephews and great nieces and nephews.
