



James D. Huebner

James “Jim” D. Huebner, age 90, of Dublin, Ohio, died on February 8, 2025 at Friendship Village of Dublin. Jim was born on May 8, 1934, in Clintonville, Wisconsin. He was preceded in death by his parents, Esther and Walter Huebner and sisters Jane Oertel and Dorothy Lobedan.

He was active in the Boy Scouts and obtained the rank of Eagle Scout. He graduated from the Beaver Dam High School, in Wisconsin, in 1952. Jim served in the Army and was stationed in Okinawa from 1954 to 1956. He graduated from the University of Wisconsin with a BBA-Accounting major in 1959, where he was a member of Beta Alpha Psi, and later received an MBA from the University of Akron.

Following graduation from U. of W., he accepted employment with the National Dairy Products Corporation (Kraft Foods) in New York City as an Internal Auditor and later as an Executive Assistant in Cleveland, Ohio. In 1964, he joined the Cleveland office of Haskins and Sells (Deloitte & Touche) where he started as a junior accountant and eventually became a manager. In 1977, he accepted employment with the American Electric Power Service Corporation as the Director of Internal Auditing in Canton, Ohio and later transferred to Columbus, Ohio. He also held positions as director of Mechanized Accounting and Treasurer. After retiring from AEP in 1998, he worked part-time with H&R Block as a Master Tax Advisor, Enrolled Agent,

and Financial Advisor.

Jim was a member of the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants, the Ohio Society of CPA's and the Financial Executives Institute. He also has been a member of the Ancient Accepted Scottish Rite, Valley of Cleveland; the Trinity Methodist Church of Beaver Dam, Wisconsin; and the Church of the Savior, United Methodist Church in Canton, Ohio.

Survivors include his loving wife of 41 years, Pamela, his brother-in-law, Howard Oertel, of Madison, Wisconsin and several nieces and nephews.

Jim chose to be cremated. Per his request a private memorial service will be held for the family in Canton, Ohio. Those who wish may contribute to a charity of their choice in his memory.
