James A. Norris, age 61, of Powell, Ohio, died suddenly on Wednesday, February 9, 2011 at St. Ann's Hospital. Born in Columbus to the late George and Dorothy Norris, Jim was a graduate of Bexley High School, Class of 1967. He was a graduate of The Ohio State University where he received his B.A., B.S. and M.A., Education degrees. Jim was a 30+ year teacher with the Columbus Public Schools before his retirement in 2003. After his retirement, he taught at Otterbein College and advised student teachers. A writer, Jim penned supplemental textbooks and was an editor and co-author, as well. An avid Buckeye, Jim was an usher at Ohio Stadium for over 40 years and was currently serving as Head of Ushers. Jim was a true renaissance man who enjoyed cooking, gardening, card-making, colloquing and was a master of trivia. In addition to his parents, he is preceded in death by his beloved niece, Lyndsey Rice and father-in-law James J. Anderson. Jim is survived by his wife of 13 years, Marilyn P.
