“ My deepest condolences to Jane's husband and family. She was truly an amazingly kind, patient and humble person.

*After several meetings with Jane in my art room at Wyandot Elementary, she and I came to consensus about her doing an artist residency in my school. I had never worked with glass in any way as an artist. Jane had never worked on a project of the scale I wanted to attempt, let alone doing it with 350 eager students in grades 3-5. Nevertheless we set out to learn from each other and take on this challenge. Albeit we on occasion we had different ideas on how to approach some of the challenges we came upon, she and I complimented each other beautifully as we worked together five mornings a week for 4-5 hours each day for several months at a time. She so graciously shared her knowledge and skills as an accomplished stained glass artist and I adapted her methods, techniques and directions to meet these young learners' comprehension and ability to safely manage the processes. The students she inspired were so extremely proud of their accomplishments of learning to cut glass, grind glass, foil and solder. Many spent their recesses and time before school volunteering to work on the 9 stained glass windows that measured 3'x4' each. Three months later the students had finished the first 9 windows for the school library and had started on the second set of 9 windows. Jane returned for a second artist residency the following year to complete the second set of windows and share her talents with another 150 new learners.*

*She worked with students, parent volunteers and small groups of teachers sharing her passion as an artist. I am afraid Jane never realized the scope of her influence on all of those whom she shared her talents. Not only did her young students beam with confidence and pride from these accomplishments but I have continued working with glass for over 10 years now since her artist residencies. Glass is now one of my preferred choices of art media and I continue to create stained glass, fused glass and grouted glass pieces of art. I owe it all to Jane for inspiring me!*
