There is a plaque in honor of his outstanding political contributions to the University. It is in Bronze and Concrete on the OSU Oval. It is known that Medicine, Mathematics and Music are the 3 M's that are frequently found genetically. Medicine surely was prominent in the Hatfield family. Interestingly, Paul's son has excelled in the field of music's as well. He and his wife are both teachers of music at Berkley College.
