



Jed Chesley Immel-Brown

June 26, 1949 - February 23, 2017

Jed Chesley Immel-Brown, 67, passed away at his home in Columbus, Ohio February 23, 2017. Originally from Dover, Ohio and a longtime resident of Grandview Heights, Jed served in Vietnam and earned a bachelor's degree from the Ohio State University. Through his company Lighting Resources, he designed, manufactured and marketed light boxes to treat Seasonal Affective Disorder. Along with his extensive consulting on light therapy, his work helped thousands of people worldwide and saved the lives of many. He was also the author of *Coping with the Winter Blues*, a guide to the treatment and management of SAD, and *Cheap Thoughts*, a book of one-liners and witticisms reflecting his unique and insightful worldview. Jed is survived by his wife of 43 years, Madeleine; three children, Allison (Sean) Sponhaltz, Jonas (Heather Wood) Immel-Brown and Casey (Mollie Wells) Immel-Brown; grandson, Roarke Sponhaltz; brother, Jerry (Althea Sumpter) Immel; cousin, Sara Strong, among other friends and family. He was preceded in death by parents, Margaret Huff Immel and Thomas Immel, and brother, Jeffrey Immel. Calling hours will be held 6-8 p.m. Friday, March 3, at RUTHERFORD FUNERAL HOME, 2383 N.
