On December 8, 2020, God called JoAnne (Kurtz) Lang home to heaven after 91 years. A native of Ironton, Ohio she started college at Ohio Wesleyan University, but then married a young naval officer and spent several years moving around the country before finally settling in Columbus and finishing her degree at Ohio State University. There was nothing she loved more than family, being with friends, old movies, good food (she was a wonderful cook!) and Ohio State football. She and husband Deke formed some of their deepest friendships with their card playing buddies. Among JoAnne's many adventures in life were vacations to Europe, Australia, and various locations in the U.S., as well as experiencing three hurricanes, two tornados, an earthquake, a sand storm, and a DC-3 landing on its last sputtering engine. She taught at Rosemore Junior High in Whitehall for 25 years. JoAnne loved this country, its history, its customs, its traditions. All her life she carried the memory of seeing Civil War veterans march in her home town parades. She was an avid gardener (especially of roses), and cultivated many friendships throughout her life as a member of the Worthington Historical Society, Women's Association of the Columbus Symphony Orchestra, and Worthington Presbyterian Church. JoAnne was also a volunteer at Riverside Hospital for many years. She was preceded in death by parents Stanley and Ethel Kurtz, and her brothers William and Robert. Survived by her husband of 70 years, Deke, daughter Linda (Bill) Yost, son Robert, and grandchildren Michelle (Eric) and Alan (Jean) Yost.
