John Henry (Jack) Duncan, age 91, of Dublin, died Friday, January 17th, 2014 after a short illness, at Columbus Riverside Hospital. He was a veteran of the United States Navy, serving as a fighter pilot in the Pacific Theater in WWII and was discharged in 1949. His Navy friends know him as "Pete."
