John Joseph Lucin, 76, passed on to eternal life on April 27, 2019 in the loving presence of his wife, Cathy and son, Jeremy, at Sunrise of Dublin, Ohio, from complications of Lewy Body Dementia with Parkinsonism. He was born in San Francisco, CA on his mother's birthday and was preceded in death by his father, Joseph M. Lucin, and his mother, Mary Kustura Lucin. Surviving family includes his wife, Catherine Dew Lucin; son, Jeremy Joseph Lucin; daughter-in-law, Tricia Williams Lucin; twin grandsons, Miles Joseph Lucin and Tate William Lucin. John was a graduate of University of Washington, BA 1966; and Cal Poly San Luis Obispo, MA, 1968. He was a financial advisor and branch manager with Paine Webber from 1971-1994, and Morgan Stanley from 1994-2012. He earned many awards and accolades throughout his career, including Manager of the Year in 1997. John was a member of Scioto Ridge United Methodist Church. He was a member of Lambda Chi Alpha and President of the Cal Poly Alumni Association in 1977. He loved the freedom he felt on the ski slopes and we hope that he is cruising right now. Starting in July 1972 as a Paine Webber Broker Trainee, I worked with John in the PWJC San Jose Branch Office. One remarkable element of John's career that seems to go unmentioned, is that he survived a collapse in the Market that followed soon after his entry into the industry. The Dow first topped 1,000 in November 1972. Then it declined to almost half of that figure by September 1974. The national Broker count declined precipitously during this difficult period. Were John not blessed with a super strong commitment to attaining success, his career in finance could have ended soon after it began. Definitely a man of integrity and high ethics, John also had a great radio voice. He held celebrity status when he did a daily Stock Market Wrap on a San Jose Radio Station. He was serious, funny and witty, all at the same time. The memories are all good ones. I am very sorry for your loss Cathy and family.*
