Emeril’s Scalloped Potatoes

(Makes 6 servings)

1 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper 1 teaspoon unsalted butter
3-1/4 lbs potatoes, peeled & cut into 1/4 inch slices 2 teaspoons salt
4 cups heavy cream, or more as needed 8 oz Swiss cheese, grated

1. Preheat oven to 400 degrees F. Lightly grease a 2-quart baking dish with the butter.
2. Bring the cream to a simmer in a large saucepan over medium-high heat. Add the salt and pepper and stir well. Add the potatoes, adding more cream as necessary to completely cover them. Lower the heat to medium-low and simmer until the potatoes are barely fork-tender, 10 to 12 minutes. Remove from the heat.
3. With a large spoon, transfer one-third of the potatoes, with some of the cream, to the prepared dish, making an even layer. Top with one-third of the cheese, and continue layering the potatoes and cheese, ending with cheese.
4. Place the dish on a baking sheet and roast until golden brown and bubbly, about 30 minutes. Remove from the oven and let sit for 5 minutes. Serve hot.
