You must also check the jungle restaurant up in the hill, but if you cannot because of a wheelchair they will be happy to cook whatever you prefer and serve you at your usual table in the restaurant. For my stay in Minahasa I was honored to have a personal assistant a nice guy who helped in every movement around the resort, he was always ready to take me to the restaurant for dinner, back to our room or the pool he was very helpful as everybody there, they all are willing to serve you the best they can, and they totally succeed!!! You don't need to think about anything, they have everything you need, and I mean everything! The room is very spacious, super clean, fully accessorized, with your own private veranda luxury! All you have to do is take a plane and fly to Minahasa Lagoon, they will take care of you for a very special holiday. I really hope to go back again, I love that place and the good hearted people there.
