On August 5th at 10:10 pm Louis Edward Albers "Lou" transitioned to his heavenly home following a 4 year battle with Vascular Dementia, Late onset Alzheimer's Disease and Cancer at Glenwood Alzheimer's Special Care Center.

Lou was born on January 29, 1937 to the late Louis Clemens Albers & Ida Marie Daum Albers. He was born in his home on Enright Avenue during the 1937 flood. He always said his Doctor arrived in a small boat.

Lou is preceded by his parents Louis & Ida Albers, sisters and brothers in law, Millie & Bill Kolkmeier and Shirley & Bill Houser; sister, Vera Meyer; brother in law, Steve Hisch; nephew, Bill Kolkmeier and niece Kathy (Kolkmeier) Randolph.

He is survived by his sister, Mary Lou Hisch; brother in law, Carl Meyer; ex-wife, Patricia Albers; his longtime friend, Barbara Erpenbeck and a host of nieces and nephews. He leaves to carry on his legacy a daughter, Monique; grandsons, Quinn & Colin, and his only granddaughter Michaela.

Lou graduated from Elder High School in 1955 and played on the only undefeated untied football team during that time in Elder High School history. Lou would share his "miracle catch" he had during a game in which his father attended during his long battle with throat cancer. His favorite color was purple or "Elder purple" and he was involved with Elder decades after his graduation.

After High School, Lou graduated from the University of Cincinnati with a Bachelors of Science in Industrial Management.

He served in the Air Force in 1960 with an honorable discharge after being called to the Berlin Crisis in Germany.

Lou began his career with Kroger as the Manager of the Olive Department and went on to work for Jaite Packaging in 1971 for over 25 years until he retired.

His hobbies were bowling, golf and hanging out with his friends from Elder, the 123rd Air Force group and "Yesterday Boys" he loved singing Frank Sinatra songs and was an avid Cincinnati Reds and Bengals fan. He loved living in Mt. Adams and was very active in his parish at Holy Cross Immaculata Church as well as his childhood parish St. Lawrence Catholic Church.

Most of all Lou was the best Father to Monique and an even more amazing Grandfather to Quinn, Colin and Michaela. He spent his life being a great role model to his family.

Lou loved Graeter's Ice Cream and would always wear a colorful hat from Graeter's. His favorite ice cream was dutch chocolate and he liked to give Graeter's hats to his family and friends.

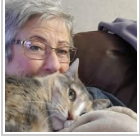
