“ Dear Kannapel Family,

I am writing to you to express my condolences on the loss of your loved one. Although I did not personally know Louise and we never had the opportunity to meet one another....she and i are connected on the Schroeder/Braucher side of our family tree.

I have been working on the Schroeder family genealogy for almost 20 years and have traced back to our immigrant ancestor.

My great grandfather, James Philip Schroeder, had a younger sister named MaryAnn L. Schroeder (1861-1926) who married William B. Braucher (1860- 1935). They resided in Albany Twp., Berks Co., PA. They had at least 5 children (Mary, Clinton, Charles, Clarence, and Louise's father William E. Braucher (April 1894- August 1941)

I enjoyed tracing Maryann's family ...and especially enjoyed learning about her son William E. Braucher. Prior to that time, I thought I was the only public school teacher on our side of the family...until I learned that William E. was also a school teacher in Palmerton and one of the winningist basket ball coaches of is time...and that he and Jim Thorpe once shared the same stage at the S.S. Palmer School.

As a child i grew up in AlbanyTwp. in the village of Kempton.and still have family living in that vicinity. I now reside in Carlisle PA. where Jim Thorpe attended the Carlisle Indian School at what is now Carlisle Barracks.. So my interst in William really peaked when i learned that he, had domne great things as a teacher and had met Olympian Jim Thorpe.
