



## Marcus Hart Sandver Dr.

September 18, 2011

Dr. Marcus Hart Sandver passed away on September 18, 2011 at his home in Columbus Ohio at the age of 62. Marcus was born August 13, 1949 in Bethesda, Maryland to Sverre and P. Gennett Sandver. He grew up in Silverton, Oregon and graduated from Silverton High School in 1967 and received a B.A. from Pacific Lutheran University in 1970. He attended the University of Colorado where he received his Masters in Labor Relations in 1973 and met his future wife Jean Hart. Marcus and Jean Hart were married from 1974-1999. Marcus received his Ph.D in Labor Relations from the University of Wisconsin in 1976. He was hired at The Ohio State University in the department of Management and Human Resources in 1976 where he remained until his retirement in June of 2011 as a Full Professor. At the University, Dr. Sandver was twice selected as a Fulbright Professor to teach internationally, first at the University of Istanbul and later at Marmara University. In 1987 Dr. Sandver authored his first book, Labor Relations: Process and Outcomes. In addition to teaching and research, Marcus was also actively involved in over 90 state and regional arbitrations and fact-findings. Marcus was an avid reader and loved traveling and discovering new places. Marcus enjoyed hunting and fishing throughout his lifetime and spent many of his happiest moments outdoors. Marcus is survived by his mother P. Gennett (Sandver) McCulloch; son, Justin Hart Sandver and his spouse, Megan Hari Sandver; daughter, Kimberly Hart Reese and her spouse, Michael Reese; his sister, Kristie Perez and her spouse, Greg Perez; and his

companion, Diane Berinato. A Memorial Service will be held at 10:00 a.m. Friday, September 23, 2011 at RUTHERFORD FUNERAL HOME, 2383 North High Street, Columbus.
