On December 20th, Margaret M. Matheson, longtime resident of Rochester, NY passed away at Parkside Village Senior Living Center in Westerville, Ohio. Mrs. Matheson was born in Hamilton, Scotland and immigrated to the United States in 1934. She became an American citizen in 1939. Mrs. Matheson worked as Head Teller and Receptionist for Eastman Savings and Loan Bank until 1963. For many years, she was the head of the Women's Group at West Avenue United Methodist Church and later was a member of various committees at North Chili United Methodist Church.
