Born in Glouster, OH, in 1925, Margie was married to 3 caring men; Robert M. Roehrer, William R. “Ziggy” Coyle, and Ronald P. Beardmore. It was with Ziggy – the love of her life – that she spent 41 beautiful years. Together, with their music stores and with their music (she as vocalist/he on trumpet), they impacted the lives of so many people in Central Ohio plus so many school music kids in the state of Ohio. And together, they built lasting friendships all over the USA (on 3 continents as well) via: the music products industry, ongoing music education endeavors, The Ohio State University, local musician support (particularly jazz), service to multiple non-profits, and neighbors on Fripp Island, SC ... their “little slice of Heaven on earth.” Along with Ziggy, Bob, and Ron ...
