Mary Lindsay Cockrell Age 80 of Worthington, Ohio passed away on Friday December 17, 2021. Born 1941 in Charlottesville, VA; daughter of Loren L. Cockrell and Josephine (Sherwood) Cockrell; raised in Charlottesville, VA and Sewickley, PA; attended Elmira College (NY) and Robert Morris University, Pittsburgh, PA. Mary held a long-standing career with the U.S. Government starting in 1965 working for the Internal Revenue Service in Washington, D.C. & New York City until 1985, then transferring to Alcohol Tobacco & Firearms for 28 years working in Pittsburgh, New York City, and Columbus, OH, until her retirement in 2013 after 48 years with the U. S. Government. Upon retirement Mary received the Albert Gallatin Award (Treasury Department's highest career service award).

Mary was a member of the Clintonville Women's Club; Ann Simpson Davis Chapter, Daughters of The American Revolution (50-year member).; Society of Mayflower Descendants in PA; an active member of the Worthington United Methodist Church and a dedicated volunteer with the Assistance League Columbus metro area and a volunteer with Mended Hearts at OSU Ross Heart Hospital. She is survived by her son, Jonathan H. Koznesoff and his wife Lori E. (Mattison) of Reynoldsburg, OH; sister Jennifer C. Hay (Thomas) and brother W.
